*Fiona's story

I let people know that 'I used to believe in drugs, but now I believe in God'.

I grew up in a good family, but we travelled a lot with my dad's work, and I spent Year 11 & 12 in boarding school, it was here that I first experienced a strong sense of disconnection from my family. I began partying. My drinking was different from my friends. With them, they seemed to have a 'stop' button, but I kept going and often experienced blackouts. I continued to experiment and party, I was having fun. When I was taking drugs or drinking, I didn't have to think about things.

I became a mum and had

3 children; the partners I chose were violent. I had been introduced to pills, speed and ICE—not a good combination for raising a family. The Department of Families removed my children from my care. I loved my children, and I tried to give up my addictions for them and had two unsuccessful attempts at rehabilitation. On one occasion, I was released back into the community and was able to care for my kids, but I didn't have the strength or support to reintegrate into family life.

I came to Teen Challenge broken but ready to get well — for my sake

(and I knew my recovery would mean my children would have the mum I was meant to be, caring for them).

I lost 16 years to drugs and alcohol; I spent 365 days in rehab and because of the love and support of the staff, volunteers and friends in the program I have been 'free' for over 13 months. The program works if you work with it.

the TCQ's Residential Rehabilitation program, Transition support, Family Support services and New Hope House emergency accommodation, people can find freedom. We can only do this because of you.



When I first came to New Hope House (NHH), I was in a very dark place. I was self-harming, suicidal and very angry. So many things had happened with my mum passing away, and I was always fighting with my dad, it was tough. I was at NHH for 3 months, and now I am leaving with a steady part-time job, a place at university, permanent accommodation, and I am back in contact with my family. I'm so proud of myself and very thankful to the staff at NHH.

*Peter's story

Before coming to New Hope House I didn't know what I was going to do with my life. I was troubled and lost with no safe place to live. I lost touch with God and I didn't think He cared about me. But since being at New Hope House I have experienced love, care and so much support. I no longer take drugs and I have found myself. I have reconnected with God and Church and I now have my own accommodation. I also discovered that I love to sing.


Focus on Your Impact Our family support program assists vulnerable families and children at risk in the community, phone often as a result of substance abuse. The aim of this program is to facilitate restoration and provide assistance to struggling families. Schnauzer Initiative

Sharon worked as a volunteer for many years in the NLC. She loved seeing the young woman find freedom from their addictions. Sharon is a dog lover, and she wanted to bring a Schnauzer into her family. Schnauzers are expensive, and both Steve (Sharon's) husband and Sharon weren't sure if this was the best way to spend their money. They both have a heart for people, and they see so much need in the world.

They got talking to Pauline (TCQ Aftercare Support Worker) and her husband Dave (a vet), and they came up with a beautiful plan. David and Pauline would give a puppy to Steve and Sharon to love, and in turn, Steve and Sharon would allow their handsome new family member, Tilly to bear 6 litters and with each puppy sold the proceeds would go directly to TCQ. It was the love of people and dogs that led to an excellent outcome for all concerned.

For the last 7 years, the men at the NLC have been provided valuable work experience and skills as they care for a small herd of cattle that were generously donated from Trelinga Stud. Every calf sold from the herd raises funds for TCQ. This initiative has generated an income stream of \$11,000 in the last financial year.

Containers for Change

The Containers for Change program is a Queensland initiative that encourages recycling. The program fosters respect for the environment and TCQ has registered as a charity recipient of this program.

Individual community members can support TCQ by directing the 10 cent refunds found on most plastic and glass bottles directly to TCQ. Our efforts also include the young women at the NLC who collect, sort and process recyclables from various businesses in Toowoomba. Every time a recycled item is processed funds are directed to TCQ.

Toowoomba Gala Dinner

In October 2019 we hosted a Gala Dinner in Toowoomba at the Toowoomba Golf Club, Middle Ridge. The support of two key volunteers, Jacinta and Cathy who were inspired by the work of TCQ, ensured the night was a memorable evening. Guests were served a three course meal, entertained by Ruby Slipperz, DJ Peter Vernon and St Joseph's College String Quintet and on the night we heard inspiring stories of hope and transformation.

Virtual Hope Gala (+Ride for Rehab)

2020 has been a year like no other. The 6th Annual Hope Gala Fundraising Dinner at Brisbane City Hall was cancelled as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. With some innovative thinking and a lot of work we switched to a Virtual Hope Gala Dinner on Saturday 13th June 2020. The event was live streamed by Crafted Media (from Pro-Cam Studios in Albion), MC'd by Olympic legend Duncan Armstrong and entertainment provided by Zeek Power. There were pre-recorded messages and live crosses to small dinner parties that were held throughout Queensland. The evening included a silent auction.

On the evening a 'Ride for Rehab' was hosted. A group of 10 riders rode (on wind trainers) at the Men's Centre in Toowoomba for the 90-minute broadcast to raise funds. \$4,000 was raised.

This event combined with the end of financial year appeal saw the goal of \$200k realised.
